The scene starts in the office of the Rome Herald and the time is now. Chief investigative journalist Cass Tenniel has heard rumours from Jerusalem about a political prisoner, Jesus Davidson, who has been hanged for treason but has later been seen alive. Tenniel, in a dramatic rush to the Jerusalem office, interviews not only the political and religious hierarchy but notably the followers of Davidson himself. Whilst offering these eye-witness accounts of the Resurrection, the play follows one man's journey from cynical reporter to agnostic enquirer, and a surprise ending.
